




CAF Transition Group improving career transition experience...continued from front page

Those in attendance learned about the mandate of the CAF TG, how the transition process is changing from a culture of release to one of transition, and the full range of support, tools, compensation and benefits available to them.

Whether a CAF member is embarking on the road to recovery, entering rehabilitation, returning to duty in the CAF, or transitioning to life after service, the CAF TG is committed to assisting them in their journey.

"We want to make sure they're ready," said BGen Misener, noting military members can have a tough time leaving the uniform behind. "They spend a long time in the military, they get good at what they do and that transition to civilian life can be hard."

There are many psychosocial aspects to transitioning out of the military in addition to leaving behind a military career and returning to the civilian world, BGen Misener noted.

Transition requires preparation and often psychological, social and emotional adjustments, both as an individual and a family.

"It doesn't only affect you, it affects everyone around you," he said. "Your families are just as much a part of the service as you are."

He stressed the importance of planning early, and taking into account the various aspects of transition like health, finances, social integration, and employment.

"If you're not prepared and you don't have a plan, you're not going to do well," he said. "Life happens, it's unpredictable, so have a plan B.

"Much like we focus on operational readiness in the CAF, I'm advocating we improve our transition readiness as we go through our career," he added. "We want to make sure, when the time comes, that you and your family are as ready as you can be."

Effective April 1 of this year, a Regular Force or Primary Reserve member and their family undergoing transition will follow an initial, chain-of-commandimplemented transition process that includes examining retention options; a recommended minimum six-month period to establish a transition plan; accessing supports and services specific to their needs; and a 30 calendar day window when the member is protected from taskings or employment to focus solely on transition.

The launch of the CAF Transition Group introduced a transition trial at Canadian Forces Base Borden which will assist in developing a permanent, standardized approach to transition that, once tested and validated, will be put in place in future across the CAF.

In the meantime, CAF TG is committed to continuous improvement, and CAF TG Chief Warrant Officer CWO Rémy Lapointe encouraged members to have their say.

"We want to make sure you have everything you need to put a plan in place... to ensure you have a good experience," he said. "To improve on what we are doing, we need your feedback."

On hand as well during the local briefings were a team of transition experts including representation from key partners like Veterans Affairs Canada, as well as Commander CAF Transition Unit Eastern Ontario (CAF TU EO) Lieutenant-Colonel (LCol) Angie Lapointe, who is in charge of Transition Centres in Petawawa, Kingston, Trenton, and North Bay.

The presentation also highlighted online tools like the Military Career Transition portal on Canada.ca, My Transition Guide, My Transition app and enhanced transition training, as well programs and services available through VAC, SISIP Financial, the Base Personnel Selection Office, and the Petawawa Military Family Resource Centre.

Each year, approximately 10,000 members release from the CAF.

A message from the Garrison **Petawawa Fire Prevention Branch:**

Portable Cooking Equipment Safety



- 1. A slow cooker is designed to be left on while you do other things, even things outside of the home. That said, there are conditions:
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions on where and how to use a slow cooker.
- Keep things that could catch fire away from the slow cooker.
- Inspect the cord to the slow cooker to be sure that it has not been damaged. Do not use any appliance with a damaged cord.
- · Make sure the slow cooker is in a place where it won't get bumped. If the lid gets dislodged, , the liquid could boil away, the appliance could overheat, and a fire could occur.



- 2. Follow the manufacturer's instructions when using a hot plate, griddle, or electric skillet.
- 3. Stay with the hot plate, griddle, or electric skillet when cooking.
- 4. Touching the surface of a hot plate, griddle, or electric skillet can burn you. Avoid touching the surface.
- 5. Do not operate a hot plate, griddle, or electric skillet with a damaged cord or plug.
- 6. Unplug a hot plate, griddle, or electric skillet when not in use and before cleaning. Allow the appliance

to cool before cleaning it.

- 7. Do not immerse heat control, cord, or plug of a hot plate, griddle, or electric skillet in water or other liquid.
- 8. Microwave Ovens: Place or install the microwave oven at a safe height within easy reach of all users. If possible, the face of the person using the microwave oven should be higher than the front of the microwave oven door to reduce the risk of a scald.
- Always supervise children when they are using the microwave oven.
- Use only microwavesafe cookware (containers or dishes). Never use aluminum foil or metal objects in a microwave oven.
- Do not leave a microwave oven unattended when microwaving popcorn, since the heat buildup can cause fires. Heat the popcorn according to the written instructions.
- Open microwaved food away from the face. Hot steam escaping from a container of microwaved food or the food itself can cause burns.
- Verify the cooking time when using a microwave oven.
- Never heat a baby bottle in a microwave oven because it heats liquids unevenly. Heat baby bottles in warm water from the faucet.
- If your microwave oven is mounted over your stove, use extra caution to reduce the risk of spills and scalds. Avoid leaning over hot burners or pans when putting things in or getting them out of the microwave oven.




The gardens will be opening in May, which is weather dependent. Due to our climate is it optimal to plant on or after the May long-weekend.

The McEachen family Catch the Ace

On Thursday, February 21, on week 50 of the Deep River and District Hospital Foundation's Catch the Ace lottery, the elusive Ace of Spades was finally caught by Mark McEachen—who has taken home \$574,584.

The real winner, however, is the DRDH Foundation, who raised around \$785,000 to

support the purchase of Diagnostic Imaging equipment for our Hospital through this lottery.

In front of a very full house at The Bear's Den in Deep River, volunteer Marlene Gibson drew the winning ticket, belonging to Mark McEachen of Douglas. Mark chose envelope 47, one of only three remaining envelopes, and it contained the elusive Ace of Spades. In addition to the weekly prize of over \$65,000 (\$1 for every ticket sold that week), Mark also received the progressive jackpot that with the week 50 contribution (\$1.50 for every ticket sold) which amounted to almost \$509,000.

The McEachens say they aren't going to rush and spend the money too quickly.

Although a family vacation or two may be in order, Channa McEachen indicated that, "for now, the money has just given us peace of mind."

The total net revenues received by the Foundation through this amazing lottery are around \$785,000, which is almost half of the Focused on You campaign goal to raise \$1.75 million for the replacement of Diagnostic Imaging equipment for the hospital.

Leo Buckley, Board Chair for the DRDH Foundation highlighted that, "the support and participation by so many volunteers made this fundraising journey a delightful, entertaining event."

The foundation and the hospital are thankful to everyone who gave their time, energy and enthusiasm to this lottery, as well as to everyone who participated and bought tickets. The lottery has awakened in the communities the importance of the hospital and the crucial issue of fundraising for capital equipment. A special thank you is owed to all the volunteers, as without them, the success of this lottery would not have been possible. In particular, the efforts of Leo and Kathy Buckley, as well as Jim and Marlene Gibson, have been extremely commendable over the course of the lottery.

For those of you who want to play again, the Foundation will be starting up another round of the Catch the Ace lottery. It is hoped that our communities will continue to buy tickets in support of our local Hospital, and help the Foundation reach the Focused on You campaign goal.

He and his partner Joseph "Joey" Melbourne are self-professed escape room addicts.

They have translated their passion into a career, jumping on the opportunity to do what they love as a job.

When creating their escape room, they focused on making the puzzles challenging and interesting yet relevant to the room's 13th-century theme. It doesn't require any specific alchemy or historical knowledge, just a good set of eyes and some problem-solving abilities.

"All you need to solve our room is what we give you," said Turcotte.

At no time is the room locked and people are free to leave if feeling claustrophobic.

"We don't want anybody to have an anxiety attack," said Melbourne. "We want everybody to have fun."

It took about two months to set up the escape room, and Turcotte and Melbourne were aided by family and friends, who both did the construction as well as helped test out the puzzles.

Feedback has already been positive.
