NPF employees strike at Garrison Petawawa Grève des employés des FNP à la Garnison Petawawa



GARRISON PETAWAWA - Approximately 150 employees of the Staff of the Non-Public Funds, Canadian Forces, represented by the Public Service Alliance of Canada (PSAC) at Garrison Petawawa began strike action on Monday, January 15.

The strike involves nearly 500 employees in Petawawa, Kingston, Ottawa, Valcartier, Bagotville and Saint-Jean/Montreal.

"Garrison Petawawa respects the bargaining process and the right of employees to legally strike, and it is important to remember that our Non-Public Funds (NPF) colleagues are a huge part of our Garrison Team," said 4th Canadian Division Support Group Commander Colonel Jason Guiney in a statement

issued earlier this week. "They are our friends and family who support us through their work with PSP, CANEX, NPF Accounting, and SISIP."

The strike will impact some services offered through recreational programming, the messes, Silver Dart Arena, Dundonald Hall aquatics, Military Fitness and Sports, CANEX, and SISIP. GARRISON PETAWAWA - Quelque 150 employés des Fonds non publics des Forces

armées canadiennes, qui sont représentés par l'Alliance de la fonction publique du Canada (AFPC) à la Garnison Petawawa, ont déclenché une grève le lundi 15 janvier.

La grève touche près de 500 employés à Petawawa, à Kingston, à Ottawa, à Valcartier, à Bagotville et à Saint-Jean/Montréal.

« La Garnison Petawawa respecte le processus de négociation collective et le droit des employés de faire la grève, et il est important de se rappeler que nos collègues des Fonds non publics (FNP) font partie intégrante de notre équipe de la Garnison », a déclaré le commandant du Groupe de soutien de la 4e Division du Canada, le colonel Jason Guiney, dans une déclaration qu'il a fait plus tôt cette

semaine. Ce sont nos amis et des membres de notre famille qui nous appuient dans le cadre de leur travail aux PSP, chez CANEX, à la Comptabilité des FNP et au RARM. »

La grève aura une incidence sur certains services offerts par les programmes de loisirs, les mess, l'aréna Silver Dart Arena, le centre aquatique Dundonald Hall, le centre de conditionnement physique et sports militaires, CANEX et le RARM. The weather outside may be frightful... but your winter safety doesn't have to be! The winter doesn't have to hinder your daily activities; by taking the right precautions, anyone can enjoy the winter wonderland that is the Canadian outdoors. Follow these cold weather safety tips for a safe and enjoyable winter:

Protect yourself from cold temperatures

Canada has some of the coldest winters globally, making the country an ideal place for winter sports enthusiasts. However, cold weather can be dangerous for those who aren't prepared for low temperatures, ice, and snow. Anyone staying outside for an extended period faces a heightened risk of cold weather injuries such as frostbite or hypothermia—which can lead to serious injuries and health impairments. Follow these prevention tips:

Dress appropriately for cold weather: layer breathable clothing, wear a toque, warm socks, gloves and waterproof boots.

Drink plenty of warm fluids but avoid caffeine and alcohol. (They can limit bloodflow.)

Stay active to maintain body heat.

Snow shovelling and icy walkways - Know the risks

While snow brings joy to many, unfortunately, someone must shovel the driveway. Each year, snow shovelling is responsible for strain on the heart caused by sudden exertion or pushing a heavy snowblower. Shovelling too much snow with improper form can also strain your back, hips, and your knees. Just as heavy snow could land you the emergency room—so can icy driveways and paths around your home or workplace. The next time you step outside to tackle a heavy snowfall, keep these tips in mind:

As with all heavy lifting, be sure to brace your core and lift with your legs rather than your spine.

Scoop less snow than you think you should—don't try to rush by lifting too much.

Stay stocked up on salt or sand for icy surfaces and steps.

Don't text or read while walking.

Wear boots or shoes that have a gripping sole.

Help keep this winter season warm and merry. Take the time to dress for the weather, safely install lights and holiday decorations, and take your time when shovelling the driveway or crossing icy pathways. Get outside and stay safe and healthy this winter!

C'est l'hiver, c'est l'hiver, c'est l'hiver... et il faut faire preuve de prudence! Ne laissez pas l'hiver nuire à vos activités quotidiennes; en prenant les bonnes mesures de précaution, tout le monde peut pratiquer des activités en plein air au féerique Royaume du bonhomme hiver (c'est-à-dire au Canada). Suivez les conseils de sécurité suivants par temps froid pour

passer un hiver agréable en toute sécurité :

Se protéger du froid

C'est au Canada que l'on enregistre les hivers les plus froids du monde, ce qui en fait l'endroit idéal pour les amateurs de sports d'hiver. Cependant, le froid peut s'avérer dangereux pour ceux qui ne sont pas préparés à affronter les basses températures, la glace et la neige. Quiconque reste à l'extérieur pendant une période prolongée court un risque accru de subir des blessures causées par le froid, comme les engelures ou l'hypothermie, qui peuvent engendrer des blessures graves et des problèmes de santé. Voici quelques conseils de prévention :

S'habiller chaudement : couches de vêtements perméables à l'air, tuque, chaussettes chaudes, gants et bottes imperméables.

Boire beaucoup de boissons chaudes et éviter la caféine et l'alcool (ils peuvent limiter la circulation sanguine).

Rester actif pour conserver la chaleur du corps.

Déneigement à la pelle et trottoirs glacés – connaître les risques

Bien que la neige soit une source de joie pour de nombreuses personnes, il est nécessaire de la pelleter pour dégager notre entrée. Chaque année, le pelletage, qui nécessite un effort soudain, ainsi que l'utilisation d'une lourde souffleuse à neige peuvent causer des malaises cardiaques. De plus, si vous n'utilisez pas la bonne technique lorsque vous pelletez une grande quantité de neige, vous risquez de vous faire mal au dos, aux hanches et aux genoux. Il n'y a pas que les chutes de neige abondantes qui peuvent vous conduire aux urgences, les entrées et les chemins glacés à proximité de votre domicile ou de votre lieu de travail présentent également des risques. La prochaine fois que vous sortirez pour vous attaquer à une bordée de neige abondante, n'oubliez pas les conseils suivants :

Comme lorsque vous soulevez de lourdes charges, assurez-vous de contracter les muscles de votre tronc et de forcer avec vos jambes plutôt qu'avec votre dos.

Pelletez de plus petites quantités de neige à la fois – n'essayez pas d'aller trop vite en soulevant de trop grandes quantités.

Prévoyez du sel ou du sable pour épandre sur les marches et les surfaces glacées.

N'envoyez pas de texto et ne lisez pas en marchant.

Portez des bottes ou des chaussures antidérapantes.

Contribuez à faire de cette saison hivernale une période chaleureuse et joyeuse. Portez des vêtements adaptés aux conditions climatiques, installez vos lumières et vos décorations des Fêtes en toute sécurité et prenez votre temps lorsque vous déneigez votre entrée ou que vous empruntez des chemins glacés. Sortez dehors et demeurez en santé et en sécurité cet hiver!





National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women • La Journée nationale de commémoration et d'action contre la violence faite aux femmes



To mark the National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women, End Violence Against Women (EVA) Renfrew County held a vigil at the Women's Monument in Petawawa on December 6, 2023, 34 years after the murder of 14 young women at Polytechnique Montréal on December 6, 1989. While the vigil marks this act of violent misogyny, it has also become a place to grieve for those who have lost their lives to gender-based violence in Renfrew County and in the province. Among the approximately 50 in attendance at the annual gathering were Garrison Petawawa Command Team Colonel Jason Guiney and Chief Warrant Officer (CWO) Jimmy Cote (opposite page, second from right and right), 2 Canadian Mechanized Brigade Group Command Team Colonel Jay MacKeen (this page on right) and CWO Donovan Crawford, Town of Petawawa Mayor Gary Serviss, Deputy Mayor Theresa Sabourin and councillor Lisa Coutu. WINTER PARKING AND SNOW REMOVAL RESTRICTIONS

Parking

Town of Petawawa Parking By-law 257/2003, Section 2.8, states:
"No person shall park a vehicle on any highway within the municipality:

- From 1:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m., November 15th to March 31st;
- At any time when accumulated snowfall exceeds or is expected to exceed 5 cm; or
- During any snow removal or clearing operation."

Failure to abide by these regulations may result in the offending vehicle being ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense.

Snow Removal by Residents

Town of Petawawa Snow Removal By-law 683/11 (General Prohibitions)

- No person shall place, or cause to be placed, ice or snow from private property or from a boulevard, onto a sidewalk or traveled portion of a highway (\$250.00 fine)
- No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, ice or snow on a boulevard that is not directly adjacent to their property, including but not limited to snow pushed or deposited across a roadway or highway (\$125.00 fine)
- No person shall place, or cause to be placed, ice or snow from private property or from a boulevard, onto the private property of another person (\$125.00 fine)
- No person shall place, or cause to be placed, ice or snow from private property or from a boulevard, in such a manner as to obstruct or hinder the access to any fire hydrant or emergency water stand within the Municipality (\$500.00 fine)
- No person shall pile, redistribute or otherwise cause the accumulation of snow on a sidewalk or traveled portion of a highway, within the municipality, in such a manner as to obstruct traffic, the view of traffic, or obstruct in any way, the movement of snow clearing equipment under the jurisdiction of the Public Works Department (\$250.00 fine)
- No person shall move, place or operate any equipment, vehicle or material on any part of a road or highway such that damage to the road surface, curbs, sidewalks or municipal services results from their actions (\$500.00 fine)

Snow Forts

As snow banks emerge throughout the Town, Public Works crews remind parents to warn children that snow forts and tunnels are extremely dangerous. Playing in snow forts and tunnels poses a very serious risk of snow collapsing and trapping a child. There is also a great danger to children playing in areas where snow removal and clearing takes place.

Waste & Recycling Pick-up

Snow banks also present problems for refuse and recycling collection crews.

Please place garbage containers, recycling and green bins five (5) feet back from the curb or pavement edge in the driveway to permit proper snow removal and avoid damage to collection containers. Do not place containers on snowbanks, sidewalks, or multi-use pathways (MUPs).

The Town of Petawawa thanks the public for its co-operation and assistance in keeping children and workers safe during the winter season.




